


The disruption in our operations that might have been expected due to Covid-19 did not happen, thanks largely to our field teams who have been exemplary in working under challenging circumstances. Our Programme Offices and CBOs also contributed significantly to district administration's efforts relating to Covid relief and continue to do so even today. The donor partners' trust in our ability to perform despite crises like Covid can be best gauged by the fact that 12 out of 17 project MoUs (Annexure 2) were signed with various partners after Covid became a global issue.

The continuing Covid Situation has altered the terms of work for most sectors of the country and Myrada's way of working will also need to be appropriately modified to meet the challenges. The traditional way of trainings by CIDORRS will need to be significantly modified and digital forms of training for our staff as well as for MPIs will have to be quickly adopted to remain relevant in a scenario where social distancing and PPE norms have to become the new normal. Our way of running our offices and documenting our field interventions will need to be re-engineered. A small step has been taken (vide Annexure 3).

Traditional developmental budgets are likely to be reduced because of a shrinking national economy, a situation which is likely to continue for 2-3 years at a minimum. NREGA, FPO promotion and land and water management for agriculture will hopefully continue to get priority, for obvious reasons. Myrada is well placed to intervene in these sectors, thanks to our nationally recognized KVK at Erode, an upcoming Green College in Holalkere, and our four years' experience in the formation and handholding of around 50 FPOs. Myrada's future efforts will be appropriately tailored to sustain our relevance in these areas.

The financial performance of MPIs – 9 CIDORS and 61 CMRCs for the year 2019-2020 is given below. The information in respect of CIDORs/ CMRCs is not based on audited accounts but on the trial balance as of 31.3.2020 reported by the Projects. Over 36 % of total expenditure incurred during 2019-2020 was on programmes which were undertaken directly by CIDORS in partnership with individual donors. The CIDORs continued the trend of investing on infrastructure to enable them to undertake more of programmes independently of head office and play a significant role in their respective districts in the field of rural development.







The Training Programme conducted by CIDORs during FY 2019-2020.



The performance of CMRCs during the year 2019-2020 was encouraging as regards their long-term sustainability. Taken together the CMRCs earned an income of Rs.207 lakhs during the year while spending Rs.187 lakhs thus garnering a substantial surplus of Rs.20 lakhs.
